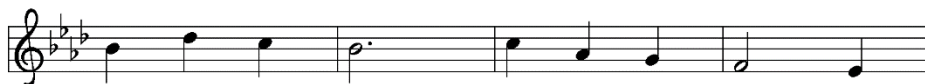

THE WORD

Acts 3:12-19

A reading from Acts, chapter 3.

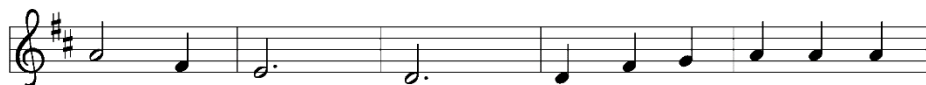
