A Word About Today's Music

Our "Lessons and Carols" is based on the format of the traditional service held each Christmas Eve in the Chapel of King's College, Cambridge, England. First presented on Christmas Eve in 1918, the service was created by Eric Milner-White whose years as an army chaplain convinced him that the church needed different forms of worship. His original service was then adapted by the Archbishop of Canterbury and almost immediately other churches further modified it for their own use as we have today.
